

# Dalhousie Kindergarten News

#### Junior Kindergarten Options

Our kindergarten students spent the month of January mastering a new set of skills – skating! We are excited to be able to showcase all we've learned on the wonderful community rink tucked behind the community centre. Thank you to the volunteers who have been working so hard to make and maintain it! As we move into February, our classroom is taking their new-found confidence and putting our creativity to work – delving into the guiding question, "what makes a good story?" More than that, we will be exploring musical concepts with our favourite music teacher, Wendy Kondrat, and building on our reading and writing skills with our playful approach to a "Writer's Workshop".

All of our enriched activities and experiences are essential to our learning and development, and one of the reasons why our program is one of Calgary's top offerings! We limit our class size to 18 students each year, and with January registration underway, we anticipate having a full class once again for the 2019 – 20 year.

Our program offers spaces for both Kindergarten and

Junior Kindergarten (JK). Kindergarten is funded by the Government of Alberta for children who will be 5 years old by March 1, 2020. While not mandated nor funded by Alberta Education, our tuition based JK program offers an option for children who are ready for an enriched program, but are not yet ready for a full Kindergarten program. JK students can include both those who may be kindergarten aged, but not quite ready for a kindergarten year. Sometimes this appeals to those who are old enough but aren't ready in terms of maturity or an underdeveloped interest in letters and numbers. For others, they may be too young for kindergarten but are advanced in literacy and numeracy and looking for an added challenge to maintain interest, enthusiasm and curiosity. Junior Kindergarten is also beneficial where parents have decided that a child's 'official' (funded) kindergarten year will be spent in a language immersion program, such as Spanish or French, or where children are developing their English language skills.

Kindergarten registration opens on Jan 29th from 6:30 – 7:30 PM and JK registrations will be accepted starting at 9 AM on Feb 4th, depending upon available space. ## Dalhousie Community Playschool News

### Why send your children to Pre-school?

- **1. It's an opportunity for growth;** adjusting to group structure, following instructions and learning to share.
- **2. It's great preparation for Kindergarten;** the children are learning pre-literacy and pre-math skills through the medium of play.
- **3. It's an opportunity to develop social and emotional development;** the children learn to spend time away from their parents, adjust to being within groups and develop skills to help with body regulation and conflict/problem resolution.
- **4. It's great to learn about choices;** children are coached through how and where to play and how to join groups while making good behavioural choices.
- **5. It's an opportunity to increase independence;** the children learn to take care of themselves and others, learn to focus while others are talking and take turns within conversation.
- 6. It promotes language and cognitive skills; the children take part in thought provoking situations, exposed to language rich activities and surrounded by hands-on materials which encourage them to observe and look for answers to their questions.
- 7. It nurtures curiosity and wonder; the classrooms are full of simple events, materials, centres and situations which encourage the children to look and learn.
- 8. It is an opportunity to gain strength in motor skills; the children are within a safe space to challenge themselves in new ways- on fitness equipment, with scissors or running with friends.

# In Our Community Drive Safely This Winter

Getting safely to your destination is easier with a bit of preparation, whether you are taking shorter trips around the neighborhood or longer excursions on the highway.

Have your antifreeze levels, battery and ignition system, brakes, heater and defroster checked on your vehicle. Install good winter tires for the best traction in slick conditions. Also, driving with your gas tank nearly full ensures that even if you are stranded that you will be able to keep warm until help arrives.

You will also want to have a vehicle emergency kit, with:

- Jumper cables
- Flares or reflective triangle
- Ice scraper
- Car cell phone charger
- Cat litter or sand for better tire traction
- Non-perishable food and water
- Blankets, extra warm clothes and winter gloves
- Small shovel

Should you need these items, you will be glad you took a few moments to plan ahead.
